Course overview

Law is a challenging course in which you will learn the basic principles of English Law and its role in society, the importance of criminal and civil law, the rule of law and examine morality and justice issues.

Entry Requirements

You must have a minimum of 5 grades 9-4 (equivalent to A*-C) at GCSE, including English and Maths at grade 4, plus you must also meet the specific subject entry requirements.

What will I learn?

This is an ideal course to learn about how laws are made and the roles of criminal and civil courts, juries, lay magistrates and judges. You will learn about criminal offences (against the person and against property) and possible defences.

If you enjoy and are curious about the law and the key cases and Acts of Parliament that have shaped it, this is the course for you.

How will I be assessed?

You will have three two hour written exams consisting of a combination of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing questions.

Where might it lead?

Where this course can lead to becoming a solicitor or barrister via a Law degree, it is also relevant for careers in teaching, journalism, the Probation Service, the military, the Civil Service, the Police or management positions.
